6 Yet have I set my king upon my holy hill of Zion.7 I will declare the decree: the LORD hath said unto me, Thou art my Son; this day have I begotten thee.

- 3. God's Son has all the brightness of God's own glory and is like him in every way. By his own mighty word, he holds the universe together. After the Son had washed away our sins, he sat down at the right sidea of the glorious God in heaven.
- 4. He had become much greater than the angels, and the name he was given is far greater than any of theirs.
- 5. God has never said to any of the angels, "You are my Son, because today I have become your Father!" Neither has God said to any of them, "I will be his Father, and he will be my Son!"
- 6. When God brings his first-born Son into the world, he commands all of his angels to worship him.
